



Johns Hopkins University Grad School of Arts and Sciences

The Zanvyl Krieger School of Arts and Sciences oversees both undergraduate and graduate programs. It is located in Baltimore, Maryland, along with other departments of Johns Hopkins University. The graduate school was named after Zanvyl Krieger, a lawyer and entrepreneur who was a generous benefactor to Johns Hopkins and the college of arts and sciences in particular.

The Zanvyl Krieger School of Arts and Sciences forms the core of the university. It was founded in 1867 by Johns Hopkins although it did not open until 1876. Faculty consists of 273 full time tenured or tenure track professors. The graduate school offers both full time and part time programs for students. The graduate programs have a student to faculty ratio of 3:1. The school has 924 full time graduate students and 1,379 part time students. Johns Hopkins graduate school is also very selective in its admissions process.

Johns Hopkins emphasis on research means that its graduate students have plenty of opportunities to research in their fields. In fact, the university receives more in federal grants than any other university in the country. At Johns Hopkins University, students are junior researchers to some of the best researchers and most brilliant minds in the country. Centers offering research opportunities include the Institute for Global Studies, the International Studies Program, the Institute for Quantum Matter, the Center for Africana Studies, and the Washington Center for the Study of American Government.

While at the university, students have access to the Johns Hopkins' impressive library system that houses more than 3.2 million volumes in ten main libraries. Graduate students are joining a university with many famous alumni and affiliates including 33 Nobel Prize winners.

Graduate students can also take part in the university's many opportunities for students. There are hundreds of student organizations, a number of which graduate students can take part in. Some organizations specifically for graduate students include the Graduate Representation Organization, the Mentoring to Inspire Diversity in Science, the Chinese Students Association, and the Black Graduate Student Association. The university also offers a number of fellowships and scholarships for graduate students such as NSF Graduate Research Fellowships.

A number of Johns Hopkins' graduate programs are among the highest ranked in both the country and the world. The graduate programs in Biological and Biomedical Sciences, Human Development and Family Studies, International Affairs and Development, and Humanities all rank in the top 10 in the country. Academic programs include biophysics, anthropology, economics, history, political science, public policy, and sociology.

Attending the Zanvyl Krieger School of Arts and Sciences gives students the opportunity to live in Baltimore surrounded by a vibrant community. There is no on campus housing for students, but many students live near campus in a number of neighborhoods such as Waverley, Hampden, Roland Park, Guilford, and Mt. Vernon among others.

The Graduate School of Arts and Sciences has a number of famous alumni. Johns Hopkins deserves its reputation as being one of the finest universities in the country for both undergraduate and graduate programs.
